**Evergreen Community Orchestra (ECO)** is an ensemble that provides an opportunity for musicians of all ages, backgrounds, and ability levels to participate in the joy of making and sharing music. Since our founding in 2014, ECO has been actively engaged in presenting free concerts throughout Snohomish County. We believe that everyone in our region should be able to access and enjoy live orchestral music as part of an appreciation of the arts.

ECO's initial membership was made up of 25 musicians. In recent years over 60 musicians have participated each season. Currently, our members range from tweens to folks in their eighties. Some are working to develop or brush up their skills, while others have played professionally in the past. There are no auditions, and ECO's teaching conductor works to ensure that each musician feels supported and valuable.

While classical music is a popular staple for orchestras such as ours, we strive to capture the diversity of interests in our region and showcase the amazing range of musical pieces available. Our concerts have included music from movies such as Harry Potter, television shows like Game of Thrones, favorites from science ficton, such as Star Wars and Star Trekeven some disco! There's something for everyone in ECO's growing music library.

**Music Director** Marcin Pączkowski is a composer, conductor, digital artist and performer, working with both traditional and electronic media. As a composer, he is focused on developing new ways of creating and performing computer music. His pieces involving real-time gestural control using accelerometers have been performed worldwide, including Daegu, Korea, Seattle, Washington, Ashland, Oregon, Toronto, Canada, and Kraków, Poland.

As the Music Director of Evergreen Community Orchestra, he presents concerts of diverse repertoire to local communities. He is involved in performing new music and has led premieres of numerous works in Poland and the United States. His conducting performances with the Inverted Space ensemble include Anahit by Giacinto Scelsi, featuring Luke Fitzpatrick on violin, Flurries by Brian Ferneyhough, and Hermetic Definition by Joël-François Durand. He is also active in the Seattle-area improvised music community performing on various instruments.

He received grants and commissions from Seattle Symphony, eScience Institute, Adam Mickiewicz Institute, and from Polish Institute of Music and Dance. He received his Ph.D. in Digital Arts and Experimental Media (DXARTS) from the University of Washington in Seattle, Washington. He also holds Masters' degrees from the Academy of Music in Kraków, Poland, and from the University of Washington.

#### **Collaborations:**

ECO resumed our collaboration with **Lee Oskar**, which began in February of 2020 following Lee's attendance of our 2019 Everett Mall performance when he watched us play his song "Low Rider". Lee is a virtuoso harmonica player, former member of the popular crossover group "War" and co-composer of the song "Low Rider." Lee performed with the orchestra in our October 2023 fall concert, featuring three of Lee's original compositions arranged for orchestra by Marcin.

**Snohomish County Music Teachers Association (SCMTA)**: ECO's second collaboration with SCMTA featured three young concerto contest finalists. ECO members were delighted to offer these gifted pianists the opportunity to perform with an orchestra for the first time.

**Everett Chorale:** ECO's collaboration with the 80+ voice Chorale began in early 2023 and culminated in a combined December 2023 performance at the Everett Performing Arts Center – including a performance of Handel's "Hallelujah Chorus"! This collaboration was successful and ECO was invited to return for the Chorale's December 2024 holiday concert.

Virtuoso guitarist **Michael Powers** performed as guest artist with ECO in our June finale concert, "The Fairy Garden" and performed five original compositions or arrangements, again with custom orchestration provided by Maestro Marcin.

# **Celebrating 10 Years of ECO**

#### A Brief History of Our Orchestra

In the beginning of 2012 it was the vision of Myrna Overstreet to establish a community orchestra for our area. In her quest she approached the Snohomish County Music Project and convinced them to establish a community orchestra. She then recruited musicians, a conductor and procured the Music Hall, the original movie theater at Everett Mall for rehearsal and concert space. For the next few years we operated under Snohomish County Music Project (SCMP) as the Music Hall Orchestra performing free concerts for the community.

It was in 2014 that we became Evergreen Community Orchestra and gained 501(c)(3) non-profit status, and became independent from SCMP while still performing in the Music Hall. When SCMP moved and said we had to move we became sort of nomads. We rehearsed in an Everett High School and Middle School. In 2021 when most reheasal venues were closed due to pandemic restrictions we rehearsed at Floral Hall at Everett's Forest Park. Finally we settled in a semi-permanent home at Our Saviour's Lutheran Church in Everett.

We have performed regularly at Everett First Presbyterian Church, the Sno-Isle Library in Snohomish, a Christmas Tree farm in Machias, a cold and icy park on the shore of Lake Stevens, a middle school cafeteria in Everett, the Snohomish County PUD Theater, at assisted living establishments, the roof top of the Imagine Children's Museum and the Everett Performing Arts Center.

Last year and this year we held a concert jointly with the Everett Chorale and Snohomish County Youth Chorus. We have had performing guests, Luke Fitzpatrick, Lee Oskar, Michael Powers and we hosted a piano concerto concert with student finalists from the annual competition by Snohomish County Music Teachers Association.

From our meager beginnings and our original 15-20 musicians with varied skill levels we needed a director and Marcin Pączkowski was hired. Our orchestra took off upward under his direction to a 45-50 accomplished musician orchestra, who love to play and share music in our surrounding communities.

We are an inviting orchestra and encourage anyone interested to come and join us, early teens to 90 and beyond!

# **ECO History**

#### The Music Hall Orchestra and Myrna Overstreet

Everett community icon, Myrna
Overstreet worked with the
Snohomish County Music Project to
found a community orchestra. First
named the "Music Hall Orchestra"
which played at the original Everett
Mall movie theater.

#### **ECO Founded**

On October 14, 2014 the Music Hall Orchestra became "Evergreen Community Orchestra" with the approval of 501(c)(3) nonprofit status by the state of Washington and the IRS.

#### **Executive Director Hired**

Gwen Parker was hired as ECO
Executive Director bringing
to ECO her grant writing and
organizational skills helping
to solidify the Orchestra's long
term success. Also, 2018 marked
the first concert performed
at Everett's beautiful First
Presbyterian Church including
our first guest artist collaboration
with Tim Noah narrating Peter
and the Wolf.

#### COVID

During the pandemic restrictions ECO members were determined to not let a virus stop them from making music. A "virtual", "low latency" orchestra was created thanks to the technical wizardry of Marcin. ECO rehearsed weekly on-line simultaneously and produced several video concerts during this time.

#### **Mayor's Arts Award**

ECO was nominated by a community member, endorsed by the Cultural Arts Commission, and selected by Everett Mayor Cassie Franklin as a recipient of the prestigious 2022 Mayor's Arts Awards presented at a ceremony held on June 23, 2023 at the Everett Performing Arts Center (EPAC)..




